## I LOVE MONDAY!

Just a few weeks ago, I introduced my sermon by talking about how nobody ever seems to write positive songs about Monday. In the 50s, it was Fats Domino singing, "Blue Monday, how I hate Blue Monday." In the 60s, the Mamas and the Papas picked up the theme: "Monday, Monday, can't trust that day." In the 70s, the normally cheerful Carpenters let us know that "Rainy days and Mondays always get me down." We can only imagine that a rainy day on Monday may have been more than they could bear. And then there was the girl group called the Bangles in the 80s, who sang that "It's just another manic Monday. Wish it was Sunday. That's my fun day. My 'I-don't-have-to-run' day." Sung like true pagans who've never had to get themselves and several kids up and ready and to Sunday School on time.

Among preachers, the "Blue Monday Syndrome" is a well-known fact of life. Some of it is spiritual. After the spiritual mountaintop of Sunday, Monday represents a valley in which the evil one shoots fiery darts of discouragement our way. Some of it is physical. For preachers, Sunday is a veritable overdose of adrenaline, and Monday is the crash after the adrenaline high. That's why every preacher is taught in seminary, "Don't ever resign on Monday." In the famous book, *You Might Be a Preacher If...* it's right there in black and white: "If you've ever typed out your resignation on Monday, you might be a preacher."

I have to admit, I've been there, burying my head in the pillow and not wanting to get up on Monday. But for me lately, I've found myself still flying high come Monday, still walking in the glow of Sunday throughout the week. God is doing such amazing things in our midst that I can't help but launch out of Sunday with an overwhelming sense of anticipation and enthusiasm about what He's going to do next. I'm sensing a new fresh wind of the Spirit blowing through our church and our worship services, a greater sense of the Lord's presence, a new spiritual health and fresh anointing in my own life and a greater degree of

excitement and anticipation in the pews. Church members are exploring new and exciting avenues of ministry. A mission trip to Guatemala is being planned. Our youth and children's ministries are proceeding with new energy under the direction of our new Children and Youth Minister. And the exciting thing is that I believe we're just scraping the frost off the tip of the iceberg of what God's going to do in weeks and months to come. Truly, the best is yet to come...and it *is* coming! If you're not here, you may end up like Thomas (the patron saint of Christians who miss church), who was absent when the Lord appeared to the disciples on the first Easter evening and then couldn't believe it when he was told about it. Let's continue attending in anticipation, speaking in anticipation, and most of all, praying in anticipation for God to move mightily among us and then through us to our community, our city, and beyond.

This Saturday night at 7:00 and Sunday morning at 10:30, the choir will be presenting the Easter musical "A.D." Then on Sunday April 4, we will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ in our 10:30 service. If you haven't yet picked up your Easter invitations to give out to your friends, neighbors, co-workers and relatives, come by the office and pick them up as soon as possible and get them out there. Remember, studies show that the unchurched and the formerly churched are most likely to accept an invitation to church during the Easter season. We want as many people as possible here on Easter.

I can't tell you how thrilled I am to be on this journey of faith with you.
